

## **Playbills**

Our playbills collection of theatre and circus bills ranges from 1781 to the 1990's. These cover theatres such as the City Varieties, The Grand Theatre, The Empire, West Yorkshire Playhouse, Theatre Royal and The Princess' Theatre as well as miscellaneous performances in other venues. Circus bills include performances by Pablo Fanque's Equestrian artists, Manders' Royal Menagerie and Sanger's Zoological Hippodrome and Mammoth Circus.

Many household names appear on the more recent playbills such as Bruce Forsyth, Ken Dodd, Barbara Windsor and Tommy Steele. Earlier artistes include Lily Langtry and Ellen Terry.

Our collection of prints covers a wide variety of subjects from execution posters to floorplans. Posters of local events and exhibitions, cinema bills, postcards, political cartoons, portraits, etchings, drawings and paintings of local buildings are well represented as well as oddities such as the calendar of the 1895 bread arch.
